

ACADEMIC ACTIVITIES

With the children settling in, the scholastic routines have begun in full earnest. With children involved in hands-on activities designed to support the curriculum, the month has, undoubtedly, gained new experiences. From categorizing food as healthy or unhealthy to making paper bags and origami dogs to playing bingo with conjunctions and checking the pulse, the students of primary years showed that learning can be fun. Scientific reasoning was the order of the day as the students of the middle years enjoyed their discussing and analysing concepts including comparing the rate of osmosis in raisins and groundnut and identifying phyllotaxy and venation in plants around the campus.

ASSESSMENTS

Students of grades 10 and 12 attempted their first Unit Tests (UTs). Papers were evaluated, shared and learning gaps were discussed. As part of routine teaching learning methods, teachers have been conducting small reviews/check ins in class to assess understanding. ACHIEVEMENTS

We couldn't have had a better start to this year with our students winning accolades. In the Math Olympiad Competition, **Nirav R Vijay** (Grade 10B) has secured a certificate in Merit. He will look into to make it to the top next year. **Prithiv Arokiadass** (grade 4B) participated in the Tamilnadu State Chess Championship and National Selection Tournament and secured 6th position at the State level by winning 7 out of 9 matches. At a district level Silambam competition held in Jain Public School which had over 300 participants, our students **K J Diya** (Grade 10B) won the gold medal in Under 17 while **K J Dhruv** (Grade 6B) and **Yukthi S** (Grade 6D) won the bronze medal.
