Come September and the school goes on a high drive – the first week characterized by scholastic activities and assemblies and following these are the honing and revision of concepts. The month culminates with the term-end assessments. With the Dussehra celebrations and vacations around the corner, we wish all our students a happy holiday and await to welcome them in October.

Here's a peek into the month's highlights.



EARLY YEARS

The festive spirit continued at GMC in the month of September with Onam and Navratri Celebrations. The young ones were seen teeming with energy doing a galore of activities in their classrooms.

Students of Montessori were introduced to classified picture cards of various categories like fruits, land transport, animals where names were given and children were encouraged to share their experiences through conversations. Hundred bead chain was given for students where they counted sequentially from one to 1 to 100. In the sensorial area, students progressed to 2Dimensional grading using brown stairs material.

In Kindergarten, students were introduced to sight words and the senior students with digraphs. In relation to the General Awareness topic, students had 'Show and Speak' session on Transport and My Family. Children brought appropriate objects and spoke confidently in front of their classmates.

As our youngest learners set off on a long break, we wish them a safe and happy time with their families and look forward to welcoming them back in October.



ASSESSMENTS

As always, arrival of assessments is preceded by revision and honing of concepts. Various strategies such as oral quizzes, framing questions, working out numericals, and use of question banks were used to strengthen the concepts under study. From the 3rd week onwards, across grades, students sat for their term-end assessments before they headed off to a well-deserved festive break.

PTM

Parents of Gr 9 and 11 continued to meet teachers to update themselves on their ward's performances. Teachers shared tips and study strategies to help better performances.

SCHOLASTIC ROUTINES

Teaching-learning strategies used in class have a profound impact on the child. More so hands-on learning where children turn into active learners. This month saw students of the lower primary years involved in a wide range of activities - building clay models of igloos to study shelters and homes, skip counting to reaffirm the numerical base.

Students of 3 to 5 were involved in a myriad of activities that reinforced the learning in the classroom – from creating acrostic poems to framing student expectations in the lab to maintaining a food journal. Students also enjoyed creating clay models of the digestive system and the life cycle of butterflies.

As we move up the school ladder, learners of the middle years discern and seek scientific and logical explanations for even the simplest of acts. The use of paper cups as speakers to study sound amplification and the application of Newton's third law of motion were a few of the activities that our children were involved in. Architectural designs and working on team projects were the mainstays of the STEM classes this month. The enthusiasm of the team produced some lively discussions and debates that pushed learners to go beyond their comfort zone.

ACHIEVEMENTS

Olympiad

A popular national and international level talent exam, the Olympiads offer the perfect platform to students to prove their mettle in the various fields of Science, Math, and GK. The test was conducted online the previous academic year and saw enthusiastic participation with several winning awards. Over 150 medals of excellence and distinction both at the national and international level were bagged by our children across grades 3 to 12. Kudos to every one of the participants and winners for bringing laurels to the school.

Silambam

In the Silambam competition organised by Aithinai Silambam Kalaikudam, Arjunan K of Grade 3B, Sree Sivani R and V M Krishcharan of Grade 6C, Rishi Ganesh of Grade 7B and Mouniga A of Grade 7C secured the 1st prize. A big shout out to these youngsters who are well on their way towards mastery of the art.

Badminton

Shivani Preme Gr 6 participated and won the first prize in the Kids Badminton tournament under-11 category.

Marathon

Keshav Krishna of Gr 8 won a certificate of achievement and medal for his participation in the Kids Marathon.

CISCE Carrom Nationals

Our children continue to make the school proud through their fantastic efforts at the CISCE Carrom nationals held at Hyderabad. Kudos to all the winners and participants for their excellent show.


