The winning trend continued with students emerging victorious in different arenas. With academic routines ongoing, interspersed with practice for the upcoming cultural day, the students have had an engaging month.

Here's a peek into the month's highlights.



EARLY YEARS

Of the many aspects that make India unique, the numerous festivals and celebrations hold a special place in our hearts. They give us a reason to rejoice and spread happiness. At GMC, the festive month began with the Independence Day celebrations followed by Ganesh Chaturthi. The festivities lit up with young children dressed in vibrant attire, involved in a range of activities modelled around the celebration.

The transitioning of the senior children of Montessori and Kindergarten into their full-day sessions was the mainstay of the month and we are happy to state that this process has been smooth.

Students are displaying steady progress in the academic areas - the Montessori students have been involved in complex activities such as the polishing of brass objects, trinomial cube, and reading and writing of phrases. The kindergarten children have been initiated into the art of writing letters and numbers. Healthy eating habits were introduced in class and reinforced on an everyday basis.



ASSESSMENTS

The scheduled second cycle of unit tests was conducted for grades 1 to 9 and 11. The test pattern was altered suitably in accordance with the Board Specimen paper pattern. ECA AND OTHER ROUTINES

SCHOLASTIC ROUTINES

Academic classes proceeded with gusto. Lessons taught using novel and time-tested strategies, activities to introduce or hone concepts, and experiential learning in the labs furthered academic learning. Connecting festivities to the topic of study helped children acknowledge and appreciate them.

INSTRUCTIONAL ACTIVITIES

Paper cups and fraction birds facilitated learning of skip counting and grammar, allowing the younger children to explore learning in a joyous manner. From turning dieticians and designing balanced diets to donning lab coats to investigate the colour changes in a chemical reaction and teasing out flower structures to observe pollen grains, handson experiences stimulated the senses and fueled their explorative instincts.


Our enthusiastic participation in Kalavaibhavam, the contest conducted at the Hindu Senior school was appreciated.
